#### **PROPOSAL REVIEW:**

Members of the Conference Planning Committee will review all completed proposals based on the criteria listed below. The committee and the Council will make final selections. Notification of acceptance will be sent by **April 18, 2025**.

- Real-World Applicability: Those attending the sessions are behavioral healthcare leaders and
  decision-makers from various public and private settings. Proposals must feature a concrete
  program, service, or initiative that resonates with these leaders; it must be practical, replicable,
  and relevant!
- **Learning Objectives:** Proposals need to specify 3 BIG IDEAS attendees must know when leaving your session to do their job better.
- Relevance to Our Audience: This conference brings together our community behavioral
  healthcare providers, substance use treatment providers, federally qualified health centers, and
  hospital and crisis intervention providers. Specific attendees include chief executive officers,
  chief operating officers, medical and nursing directors, psychiatrists, clinical directors, financial
  officers, community support supervisors and specialists, community mental health liaisons,
  healthcare home directors, and substance use directors. Proposals must be relevant to this
  audience.
- Audience Engagement: Proposals should include examples of audience engagement and adult learning strategies that will be utilized in the session. Examples include, but are not limited to, assessing the audience's prior knowledge to guide your presentation and activities that promote higher-level thinking, including discussions, case studies, and role plays.

**The Selection Process:** We strive to offer a balanced program of educational sessions by selecting proposals that best fit within the framework of the conference.

**Proven Speaking Ability:** The conference committee seeks experienced presenters with proven speaking ability. Those with a track record of speaking and performing well at large conferences will be given preference.
