#### **MENTAL HEALTH AMONG AUTISTIC LGBTQ+ YOUTH:**

LGBTQ YOUTH WHO ARE DIAGNOSED WITH AUTISM HAD OVER 50% GREATER ODDS OF ATTEMPTING SUICIDE IN THE PAST YEAR COMPARED TO THOSE WHO HAD NEVER BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH AUTISM.

# Celebrating Momens History Month

Women's History Month is a month dedicated to reflecting on the often-overlooked contributions of women to U.S. history. From <u>Abigail Adams</u> to <u>Susan B. Anthony</u>, <u>Sojourner Truth</u> to <u>Rosa Parks</u>, the <u>timeline of women's history milestones</u> stretches back to the founding of the United States.

The actual celebration of <u>Women's History Month</u> grew out of a weeklong celebration of women's contributions to culture, history, and society organized by the school district of Sonoma, <u>California</u>, in 1978. Presentations were given at dozens of schools, hundreds of students participated in a "Real Woman" essay contest, and a parade was held in downtown Santa Rosa.

A few years later, the idea caught on within communities, school districts, and organizations across the country. In 1980, President <u>Jimmy Carter</u> issued the first presidential proclamation declaring the week of March 8 as National Women's History Week. The U.S. Congress followed suit the next year, passing a resolution establishing a national celebration. Six years later, the National Women's History Project successfully petitioned Congress to expand the event to the entire month of March.
