The Impact of Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics in Missouri

Recognizing the patient health outcomes and behavioral healthcare system enhancements with CCBHCs operating in Missouri since 2017.

Jefferson City, MO. June 18, 2024 – The Missouri Behavioral Health Council (MBHC) proudly celebrates the 20 Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHCs) diligently serving our communities since 2017. These clinics, operating statewide and available to every Missourian, have coordinated primary care gaps, avoided unnecessary jail and emergency department visits, responded to individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis, and transformed mental health and addiction services, providing access to quality care.

Making an Impact

Since their inception, CCBHCs have made a profound impact on the lives of Missourians. Here are some remarkable outcomes:

- 1. **Improved Access:** CCBHCs offer crisis services 24/7, ensuring that anyone seeking mental health or substance use care receives timely assistance, regardless of their ability to pay. CCBHCs saw an **83% increase** in patients served since 2017.
- 2. **Post-Hospitalization Follow-Up:** In 2022, CCBHCs **achieved an 82% rate** of 30-day post-hospitalization follow-up for adults hospitalized with mental illness and reduced the number of emergency room encounters by **36%** and hospital encounters by **35%**.
- 3. **Opioid Crisis Response:** These clinics play a pivotal role in curbing the opioid crisis, providing comprehensive, evidence-based services, including medication-assisted treatment (MAT). Missouri CCBHCs have increased access to medication-assisted treatment by **268**%.
- 4. **Justice System Collaboration:** CCBHCs actively collaborate with justice entities, training law enforcement officers, supporting pre-release initiatives, and expanding outreach to individuals involved in the justice system. CCBHCs have partnered with local law enforcement agencies to receive referrals of those needing behavioral health services and followed up on almost **23,000** adult referrals and **over 4,000** youth referrals.

Missouri has been innovative and transparent regarding data reporting and outcomes for CCBHCs and the programs they provide. Additional data can be viewed on the latest <u>Missouri Year 6 CCBHC Impact Report</u>. In addition, the Missouri Behavioral Health Council and CLIVE Solutions have developed the <u>Missouri CCBHC Impact Dashboard</u> to provide the public with access to the patient demographics, measures, and client satisfaction reported for each CCBHC in Missouri.

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Brent McGinty, President and CEO of Missouri Behavioral Health Council, reflects on this journey:

"I remember very early in the CCBHC demonstration our champion, Senator Roy Blunt, saying, 'Brent, Senator Stabenow and I are going to need the data.' Our member agencies embraced this concept, and we've been rigorously collecting annual performance data and building out actionable population health tools to give our front-line staff the data they need to improve outcomes. Partnerships with innovators like Netsmart and AWS have been invaluable in driving this system improvement. We look forward to positioning Missouri at every opportunity at the leading edge of this national CCBHC movement."
