01. **Missourians served by CCBHCs** | Patients served by the 19 CCBHCs. Reported by each CCBHC. Baseline year (SFY 2017), Year 3 (SFY 2020), Year 6 (SFY 2023). DMH certified five new CCBHC providers in 2022.
02. **Increase in patient access to care** | Percent increase of patients served by CCBHCs from baseline year (SFY 2017) to Year 6 (SFY 2023). Reported by each CCBHC.
03. **Veterans and active military served by CCBHCs** | Veterans and active military served by CCBHCs from July 2022 – June 2023 (SFY 2023). Overall increase in veterans and active military serviced from baseline year (SFY 2017) to Year 6 (SFY 2023). Reported by each CCBHC.
04. **Providing medication-assisted treatment (MAT)** | Patients who received MAT by the CCBHCs from baseline year (SFY 2017) to Year 6 (SFY 2023). Overall increase of MAT provided from baseline year to Year 6. Reported by each CCBHC.
05. **VBP measures** | Overall statewide performance of CCBHCs in SFY 2022. Reported by the Missouri Department of Mental Health (DMH).
 - a. Follow up after hospitalization for mental illness (youth) FUH-CH | goal is 71%
 - b. Follow up after hospitalization for mental illness (adult) FUH-AD | goal is 67%
 - c. Adherence to antipsychotic medications for individuals with schizophrenia SAA-BH | goal is 67%
 - d. Engagement of alcohol and other drug dependence treatment IET-AD | goal is 27%
 - e. Suicide risk assessment for depression (youth) SRA-C | goal is 75%
 - f. Suicide risk assessment for depression (adult) SRA-A | goal is 75%
06. **Reducing hospital and ER utilization** | Measuring the number of hospital and ED encounters per 1,000 member months. Reported by the Missouri Institute of Mental Health (MIMH) using the population enrolled in the behavioral healthcare home program through December 2022.
07. **Measuring progress and improvement measures** | Overall statewide performance of CCBHCs in SFY 2022. Reported by the DMH.
 - a. Follow up after emergency department visit for mental illness within 30 days (ages 6 and older) FUM
 - b. Unhealthy alcohol use screening and brief counseling PCR-BH
 - c. Weight assessment and counseling for nutrition and physical activity (youth) WCC-BH
 - d. Diabetes screening for individuals with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder using antipsychotic medications SSD
08. **Workforce recruitment** | FTE reported by the CCBHC providers. Reporting period is the baseline year (SFY 2017) compared to Year 6 (SFY 2023). Positions highlighted include licensed clinicians, adult psychiatrists, and peer specialists.
09. **Referrals from law enforcement** | Total statewide referrals from law enforcement received by Community Behavioral Health Liaisons (CBHL) and Youth Behavioral Health Liaisons (YBHL) from July 2022 – June 2023 (one year). Reported by each CBHL and YBHL.

01. **Follow up after hospitalization for mental illness (youth) FUH-CH**
 Percentage of discharges for children and adolescents ages 6–20 who were hospitalized for treatment of selected mental illness diagnoses and who had an outpatient visit, an intensive outpatient encounter, or partial hospitalization with a mental health practitioner within 30 days of discharge.
02. **Follow up after hospitalization for mental illness (adult) FUH-AD**
 The percentage of discharges for consumers aged 21 and older who were hospitalized for treatment of selected mental illness diagnoses and who had an outpatient visit, an intensive outpatient encounter, or partial hospitalization with a mental health practitioner within 30 days of discharge.
03. **Adherence to antipsychotic medications for individuals with schizophrenia SAA-BH**
 The percentage of consumers ages 19–64 during the measurement year with schizophrenia who were dispensed and remained on an antipsychotic medication for at least 80 percent of their treatment period.
04. **Engagement of alcohol and other drug dependence treatment IET-AD**
 The percentage of consumers aged 13 and older with a new episode of alcohol or other drug (AOD) dependence who received the following: (1) initiated treatment through an inpatient AOD admission, outpatient visit, intensive outpatient encounter, or partial hospitalization within 14 days of the diagnosis, and (2) had two or more additional services with a diagnosis of AOD within 30 days of the initiation visit.
05. **Suicide risk assessment for depression (youth) SRA-C**
 The percentage of consumer visits for those consumers ages 6–17 years with a diagnosis of major depressive disorder with an assessment for suicide risk.
06. **Suicide risk assessment for depression (adult) SRA-A**
 The percentage of consumers aged 18 years and older with a diagnosis of major depressive disorder (MDD) with a suicide risk assessment completed during the visit in which a new diagnosis or recurrent episode was identified.
07. **Follow up after emergency department visit for mental illness within 30 days (ages 6 and older) FUM**
 The percentage of emergency department (ED) visits for consumers aged 6 and older with a primary diagnosis of mental illness, who had an outpatient visit, an intensive outpatient encounter or a partial hospitalization for mental illness and received a follow-up with a mental health practitioner within 30 days of the ED visit.
08. **Unhealthy alcohol use screening and brief counseling PCR-BH**
 The percentage of consumers aged 18 years and older who were screened at least once within the last 24 months for unhealthy alcohol use using a systematic screening method and who received brief counseling if unhealthy alcohol use was identified.
09. **Weight assessment and counseling for nutrition and physical activity (youth) WCC-BH**
 The percentage of children ages 3–17 who had an outpatient visit with a primary care practitioner (PCP) or obstetrical/gynecological (OB/GYN) practitioner and who had evidence of body mass index (BMI) percentile documentation during the measurement year.
10. **Diabetes screening for individuals with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder using antipsychotic medications SSD**
 The percentage of consumers ages 18–64 years with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder dispensed an antipsychotic medication and had a diabetes screening test during the measurement year.
