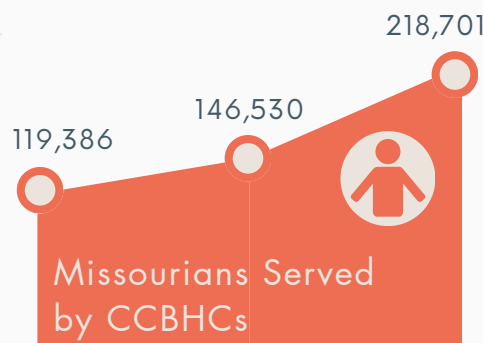
Operating CCBHCs since **2017**

Missouri was one of the original eight demonstration states selected for the CCBHC model, which was enacted by the Excellence in Mental Health and Addiction Treatment Act in 2014, transforming the way behavioral health services are funded and closing the disparity between physical health and behavioral health services. Missouri has CCBHCs serving every county in the state.

Patient Access to Care

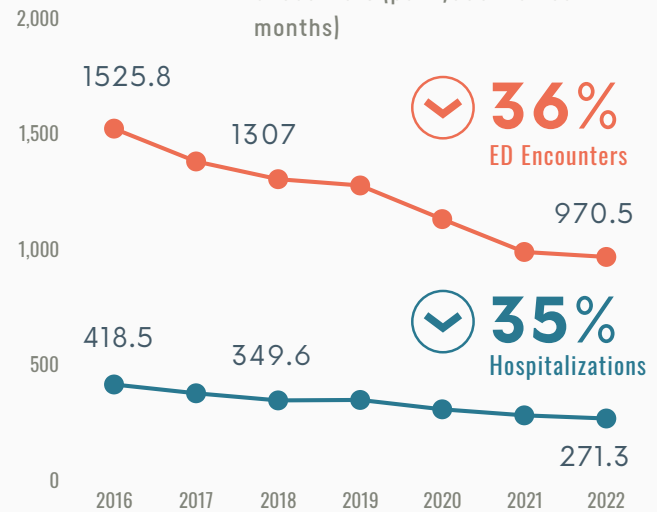

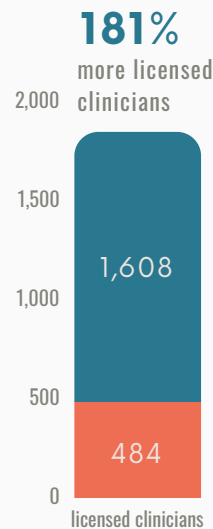

Law Enforcement Collaboration

CCBHCs have partnered with local law enforcement agencies to receive referrals of those in need of behavioral health services. Referrals reported July 2022 - June 2023:

> **22,821** Adult referrals

> **4,188** Youth referrals
