
## Operating CCBHCs since 2017

Missouri was one of the original eight demonstration states selected for the CCBHC model, which was enacted by the Excellence in Mental Health and Addiction Treatment Act in 2014, transforming the way behavioral health services are funded and closing the disparity between physical health and behavioral health services. Missouri has CCBHCs serving every county in the state.

#### **Patient Access to Care**





### Workforce Recruitment

90% more licensed clinicians

CCBHCs have seen growth in their care team positions from baseline to Year 7 (FY24).



### **Crisis Centers**

CCBHCs are operating **20** Behavioral Health Crisis Centers (BHCC) across the state. BHCCs are an urgent care center for people experiencing a behavioral

BHCCs provided care for 41,587 Missourians in Year 7.

87% of those individuals were stabilized. The rest either transferred care or left against advice.

### Law Enforcement **Collaboration**

CCBHCs have partnered with local law enforcement agencies to receive referrals of those in need of behavioral health services. Referrals reported July 2023 - June 2024:

> 20,776 adult referrals

5,984 youth referrals
